# One Step Closer For For Purchase of The

Barrhill Development Trust submitted a Stage 1 grant application to the Scottish Land Fund and has since been advised that the application was successful and a Stage 2 application. The Scottish Land Fund (SLF) is a programme which supports community organisations across Scotland to own land, buildings and other assets and is funded by the Scottish Government.

Barrhill Development Trust has applied to the Scottish Land Fund for funding for the purchase price of The Trout Inn. The Trust would then use some of the wind farm benefit funding that Barrhill receives, to refurbish the building and subsidise the salary costs for the first two or three years.

Land Fund is successful, we will be able to purchase the Trout Inn, using this funding, according to the wishes of the community. After extensive feasibility work, research and costings had been carried out, a community consultation was held, seeking feedback about the that the Trust has been invited to submit proposed project. 76% of the community voted FOR the community purchasing and running/managing the Trout Inn as a bar and restaurant.

> If the Stage 2 application is not successful, the Trust would communicate this with the community and carry out another vote as to whether the community would want to proceed with the purchase of the Trout Inn using the Barrhill wind farm benefit funding.

We are beginning the process of transferring Barrhill Memorial Hall, bowling green and community car park assets to Barrhill Development Trust. The Development Trust will gradually take on the projects of Barrhill Community Interest Company, including the management of the Memorial Hall, youth work, community events, Barrhill planters, Liam's Handyman projects and longer-term legacy building projects, such as managing community-run facilities and businesses (Trout Inn).

Barrhill Community Interest Company has been retained, primarily to continue



to issue the annual winter fuel payments, as this is not considered charitable (it is not means tested). BCIC also continues to operate the grants and bursaries.

# DON'T HAVE SUPERFAST BROADBAND? SEND US YOU

BDT has been trying to tackle the lack of fibre broadband connectivity for properties outside of Barrhill itself and has contacted Digital Scotland Superfast Broadband (DSSB) programme. Unfortunately there are no future plans to carry out any further work on properties outside the village under the DSSB programme. Although the Scottish Government has committed to providing 100% superfast broadband to all properites across Scotland through the Reaching 100% (R100) programme, there is no definitive timescale as to when Barrhill is likely to benefit from this.

However, there is another area BDT could explore - a jointly funded solution with Openreach Community Funded Partnerships, whereby Openreach fund part of the costs of installing superfast broadband and then BDT would match fund the shortfall. At this stage they are unable to provide a quote until we have a list of ALL PROPERTIES REQUIRING SUPERFAST BROADBAND.

Therefore we are asking for the POSTCODES and LANDLINE PHONE NUMBERS of all properties (homes and businesses) not currently connected to superfast broadband. Please send this information to Amy; amy@barrhilldevtrust.org, or pop into the Memorial Hall office on a Tuesday.

We share the portable stage with Barrhill Primary School, so will be able to use that for any performances, gigs or events in the hall requiring a stage.
